## Safe Connections Street Outreach

The Safe Connections Street Outreach Program provides services to runaway, homeless, and street youth to help them find stable housing and access to services. This program focuses on developing relationships between outreach workers and young people to allow them to rebuild connections with caring adults. SNAP is a 13 week, group program that helps children ages 6-11 and their parents learn how to effectively manage their emotions and keep problems small. The primary goal of SNAP is to help children to stop and think before they act and empower them for improved family relationships, positive social interactions and success in school.
